Upon being promoted to Captain, Wilcox was selected to command the State Police Detective Unit attached to the Hampden County District Attorney's Office in Springfield. He had previously served in this office as a Trooper where he successfully resolved numerous homicides over the course of six years.

Wilcox spent the latter portion of his career working out of General Headquarters in Framingham. As a Detective Captain and a Major, Wilcox oversaw the numerous investigative units within the Division of Investigative Services across the Commonwealth. During his tenure in Framingham, he earned a certification from FLETC as a Use of Force Instructor and served as the President of the Department's Use of Force Review Committee.

Later, Wilcox was then promoted to Lieutenant Colonel of the Division Commander of Homeland Security and Preparedness, LTC Wilcox oversaw the day-to-day operations of some of the Department's most high-profile units including the Air Wing, Fusion Center, F.B.I.
